Travel Insurance????: When do you need travel insurance in Australia is always a tricky one. As a rule, most policies will not cover medical expenses as these are generally covered under public health provisions. However, you should consider what would happen if you need to be transported to hospital – do you have ambulance cover? Domestic policies will cover for additional expenses incurred while in hospital, accidental death, personal liability, expenses incurred due to a delay or cancellation and loss of luggage and personal effects. Some of these things you may have covered under additional policies such as life insurance or home contents so it is worthwhile considering just what you need. For added peace of mind, purchasing travel insurance may be a godsend when there is the possibility of unforeseen nasties.

Caravan Water Pressure Reduction Valve: Nearly every caravan has this type of valve at their water inlet on their caravan. The valves have a limited life due to rubber seals and volume of use. The valve cannot be repaired by a home handyman. Replacement can be purchased from Clean Water Products 2/1 Doherty Close Warnervale 2259 4393 1361 for \$55 -\$60. Part No. FMSC350. The manager's advice to caravanners was that every time we return home from a trip into country areas where we may have picked up Bore Water. Then we should thoroughly flush our vans water pipes and tanks.

**Preventative Maintenance**: One of those items we sometimes overlook or simply don't know about is the very important need to check the anode in our caravan hot water system. They need to be checked at least every 6 – 12 months. Before starting this operation make sure the power (240 volt), also your 12 volt water pump and also any

water supply are all turned OFF. Release the water pressure then turn on your hot water tap or pull the relief valve (one with the red tube on it) Once the pressure is released use a socket and undo the anode and let the water along with any material flush out. The white material that flushes out lets you know that the anode has been doing its job. When you are sure the system is flushed (if needed the water can be connected and turned on for extra flush).

Put some tape thread on the anode and reinstall. Once in make sure the system is refilled and any air bled off. A hot water tap can be turned on or the relief valve activated. Once you can see water coming out of the valve in a steady stream with no air close valve and check for leaks and if all OK connect power. The condition of the anode will depend on where you have travelled and what the local water was like. This also effects how the anode wears. Reproduced from Jayco Magazine
