Subject: RE: Insurance

Hello Fay,

Insurance policies can be confusing. The Public Liability policy is members' protection in case they unintentionally cause injury or damage to other people or their property. The committee members are also protected by a 'Directors & Officers Liability' policy. This policy protects committee/office bearers of the Club or association for an alleged wrongful act or breach of their duties whereby a member or third party allege a financial loss.

Members and visitors are responsible for their own property and actions therefore, it may be wise for all committees to occasionally remind their members/visitors to check their safety standards.

If one of your members causes personal injury or property damage to a person or property, as a result of negligence, then only the members (not visitors) are covered by Public Liability. Members would also be protected if any vicarious liability was attributed to them from actions of others, especially minors. Any visitor to your club would have the same rights as a member of the public in respect of bodily injury/damage to property caused through the negligence of one of your members.

A caravan park would have their own public liability for themselves. In other words, if one of your members is hurt or suffers any financial loss because of the park's negligence then the park's public liability should cover the caravan park if anyone makes a claim.

I'm not sure if all clubs are aware that there is an excess fee of \$1,000 if a claim is made (paid by the relevant club). This isn't new – it was the same under the previous policy. If a claim is made from an incident, which occurs at a state rally, then the State Association pays the excess fee because the host club is acting on behalf of the NSW Assoc. Unfortunately, if a claim is successful then all fees would probably go up for the 4,900 members (number of RV's under our policies).

Please ring me if this explanation is too confusing.
