Valla Beach Tourist Park:

Valla Beach Tourist Park is located 10 minutes north of Nambucca Heads.

What you need to know about D Shackles by Oz Nomad · March 13, 2015

The forums and Facebook have been in overdrive lately with regard to the use of 'rated shackles' for towing. This 'buzz' was due to a rumour that police were actively enforcing specific requirements for D shackles, with claims that police were issuing infringement notices for non-load-rated D shackles – yikes!

It seems appropriate then that this month's question from the OzNomad Facebook group looks at the current Australian Standards and their official application in terms of the regulations around Rated D Shackles

How should Bow and D shackles be used?

Throughout Australia, safety chains are required as part of the towing equipment on your trailer. They connect the trailer's A-frame, or drawbar to the tow-bar framework of the towing vehicle using D or bow shackles. They are intended as a safety device should the hitch fail, and are fastened between the tow vehicle and trailer (caravan, boat, box trailer etc). Therefore the chains, and consequently the shackles, must be strong enough to keep the trailer connected to the towing vehicle and prevent the drawbar from hitting the ground if the coupling fails or becomes disconnected. Where fitted (read; most modern caravans

these days), the two safety chains should be crisscrossed so that in the event the hitch fails or becomes disconnected, the chains form a cradle like structure aiding the chains ability to support the hitch from coming into contact with the ground. (See below guidance material)

What are the rules / regulations?

According to the Caravan Industry Association of Australia (CIAA), Police and Motor Transport Departments have dismissed the rumours of active enforcement as just that – rumours! In a recent media release, the CIAA stated that the current standard for shackles is AS 2741-2002, but noted that the standard doesn't cover the use of rated shackles for the purpose of attaching a trailer to a tow bar, it is instead focuses on the use of shackles for the purpose of lifting items.

So what should I do?

Although the standard for shackles isn't specifically related to towing, the CIAA recommends use of shackles meeting the AS 2741-2002 standard be used to secure rated safety chains up to 3500kg capacity. Additionally it is recommend that shackles should also have the following characteristics: Either bow or D shackles are fine, a shackle grade stamp of "S" or "6", shackle diameter of 10mm and a working load limit of at least 1 ton. I hope that this helps dispel some of the confusion out there and stops you breaking into a cold sweat every time a police officer drives by! So although there aren't any specific towing shackle specifications. when towing your trailer, boat or caravan you'd be well advised to adhere to guidelines that 'are' available to us. At the end of the day we all want the caravan to arrive at our destination with us and not end up a twisted mess on the side of the highway or bush track! End of copy
